Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) Services Now Covered

CountyCare will now cover ABA services effective November 1, 2020. ABA services consistent of specialized therapeutic interventions that use a variety of techniques grounded in behavioral science to reduce disruptive behaviors and to increase pro-social behaviors in real-life settings and situations.

ABA services are available to individuals who are:

- 1) under the age of 21; and
- 2) who have been diagnosed with an Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) as indicated by a Comprehensive Diagnostic Evaluation; and
- 3) who have been referred for ABA services by a physician; and
- 4) for whom ongoing ABA services are recommended by a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) on a Behavior Assessment and Treatment Plan (BATP)

Provider Qualifications

ABA services may be rendered by the following qualified professionals:

- <u>Board Certified Behavior Analysts (BCBAs)</u>: BCBAs must be credentialed by the Behavior Analysts Certification Board (BACB) and be licensed as either an LCP or an LCSW.
- Registered Behavior Technicians (RBTs): RBTs must be credentialed by the BACB, have a high school diploma or GED, and maintain a written collaborative agreement with a BCBA who provides direct supervision to the RBT.

Covered Services

1. Behavior Assessment and Treatment Planning (BATP): The BATP is the formal assessment and treatment planning process to evaluate a child's current functional impairments and disruptive behaviors and to identify the treatment goals, objectives, and recommendations for ABA services. BATP and BAI services may be conducted by a Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) or a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA).





2. <u>Behavior Analysis Intervention (BAI)</u>: BAI services are therapeutic interventions conducted with the child, or the child's caregiver, to improve the child's functioning and enhance pro-social behaviors through direct observation, measurement, and functional analysis of the relationships between environment and behavior.

Service Codes and Rates

ABA services provided by an RBT seeking reimbursement shall be submitted by the collaborating BCBA (Billing Provider) with the RBT identified as the Rendering Provider in Loop 2310B of the 837P.
