
Birth Weight

HealthChoice IL Quality Strategy

- To support health equity and HFS' mission, and to drive progress in the five pillars of improvement, HFS restructured its P4P program for MY2021
 - Right Care, Right Time, Right Place
- P4P Measures Still waiting to receive performance goals, baseline rates based off MY2019 Statewide performance
- Reporting Measures Measures that will be incorporated as P4P measures in subsequent years after health plan baseline rates are established
- Measures may be HEDIS based or encounter data based

- Need additional technology initiatives to streamline and enhance data collection and integration




Performance Measure Next Steps






Vaccine Distribution Updates- Phase 1B

Unanswered Q&A

How often can members receive the ILS meal packages? My members are often asking for additional meals.

Each referral allows 14 total meals (or up to 2 meals/day for 7 days for 1 week). A second referral must be sent to authorize an additional week of meals. This is an emergency program and not a standard CountyCare benefit. Please use the ILS referral form and send to both ccsemergencymeals@ilshealth.com and emergencymeals@cookcountyhhs.org.

The service can be used for CountyCare members who:

- 1) Have been discharged from the hospital (up to one week from d/c date) OR
- 2) Are homebound due to COVID-19 precautions, age, or disability




CountyCare Announcements

- COVID-19 Vaccine Text Campaign began the week of 2/1/21
 - No out-of-pocket costs for members, even if received out-of-network
 - CountyCare will cover COVID-19 vaccines approved by FDA (Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna)


Behavioral Health Access Line (BHAL) 1.844.433.8793

- BHAL Hours: 8:30am-6pm, Monday-Friday
- Staffed by LCSWs who can make appointment for caller within 1-week
 - You can call member or member can call. No referrals without patient or responsible party also on phone
 - Voicemails answered same day or next business day
- Initial screening takes 15-20 minutes
 - Demographic information, brief mental health and substance use history, risk assessment, information about presenting problem
 - Staff identify geographic preference and patient preference to determine appt location
- Providers located throughout City and suburban Cook. Services include:
 - Assertive Community Treatment, Community Support-Treatment, Psycho-social rehab services, MAT,
 SUD services, counseling and psychiatry
- Stand-alone psychiatry appointments are not offered. Members must also be involved in another service, such as counseling or therapy





Free Tax Assistance

- The City of Chicago & nonprofit partner, Ladder Up, offer free tax help throughout tax season and at various points in the off-season
- Operating Drop-off Tax Services only and will require everyone to have an appointment before entering a location (River North or Springfield only)
- Who is eligible for free tax help?
 - Families earning up to \$57,000 annually
 - Individuals earning up to \$30,000 annually
 - Taxpayers who need to file amendments (Form 1040X or Form IL-1040X) must make an appointment for summer sessions


